Relevant contextual information about your school and School Development Plan:

- Falconridge School is a K to 6 elementary school with a diverse population (54% of students are identified as EAL, 17% of students have a special education code, and 7% of students self-identify as Indigenous)
- Technology is integrated into the design of learning tasks and students may access Google Classroom, educational websites, apps, and inclusive technology (speech to text and text to speech) to demonstrate their understanding of concepts across the curriculum.
- Our School Development Plan has a task-design goal focused on improving student engagement and, as such, teachers and students are using a variety of digital learning apps and websites to engage students with voice and choice.

- Alberta Education Assurance Survey results for grade 4
- Within the CBE Student Survey for grade 5 and 6, 60% of Falconridge Students identified that they take care of themselves by making sure to not have too much screen time. While this is a positive increase of 17% from the previous year, this is still significant.
